Lesson 11: ABRAM'S CALL

GENESIS 11:27 - 12:20

Abram was a descendant of Shem, one of Noah's sons. He lived in the great city of Ur of the Chaldees. Ur was wealthy, and sophisticated city with temples, and a great library containing thousands of clay tablets.

Abram was the son of Terah, he had two brothers, Haran and Nahor. Haran died in the land of Ur. Abram and Nahor both married. Abram's wife was Sarai, and Nahor's wife was Milcah. Abraham and Sarai had no children.


PRINCIPLES:
