## Lesson 12: LOT'S BAD CHOICE

## GENESIS 13:1-18

Abram left Egypt with his wife, and all his possessions. Lot his nephew went with him. Abram was very rich in cattle, in silver, and in gold. He traveled from the south to Bethel where headed been before. At the place where he had first bill an altar to the Lord, Abram stopped to call on the Lord.

Lot, who was traveling with Abram, also had folks and herds tents. Because there are so many animals and servants, there was not enough room for all them to continue to live together. The herdsman of Abram and Lot began to fight with each other over the pasture for the animals.

I will make your descendants so many that they will be like the dust of the earth. So that if a man could count the number of the dust, then he can count your descendants. Get up and walk thought the land. I will give it all to you."

Then Abram removed his tent, and came to the plain of Mamre which is in Hebron. There he built an altar and worshipped the Lord.

It looks from the scene like Lot got the better deal. H certainly thought that he did. He was selfish and choose what he thought was the better land. But Lot did not consider the influence of the inhabitants of the land. The people of the plain were wicked and would bring their influence of evil upon Lot and his family.
