IT'S TOO LATE! Numbers 13: 1- 14: 45 August 3, 1997

Did you ever finally decide to do the right thing, but by then it was too late? That is what the nation of Israel did. They disobeyed and disobeyed the Lord. Then, when it was too late to receive the blessing, they finally decided to do what God had commanded them to do. But by the time that they decided to obey the Lord, it was too late! The Lord had taken away their chance to posses the promised land.

How foolish we often are, thinking that we know better than God, and going our own way, until the consequences of our wrong choices catch up to us, and the blessing that God wanted to give us has slipped away.

This is what it happened. The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, "Send men to search the land of Canaan, which I give to the children of Israel. From every one of the twelve tribes send one man. One ruler from each tribe of the children of Israel shall go."

Moses sent the twelve men that were chosen, one from each tribe, among them were Joshua of the tribe of Ephraim and Caleb of the tribe of Judah. Moses sent the men to spy out the land of Canaan from the wilderness of Zin to Rehob by way of Hamath. Moses commanded them to look at the land and see what it was like, and the people that lived in the land, what they were like. They were to see whether the inhabitants of the land were strong or weak, few or many. The men were to spy out the land whether it was good or bad, and the cities whether they were tents or fortified cities. Moses told them to search the land to see how good the crops were, and whether there were woods or not. Moses said, "Be of good courage and bring back some of the fruit of the land." It was about the time when the first grapes would be ready.

So the twelve men went into the land that the Lord had promised them. At a brook called Eschol, they cut down a branch with a cluster of grapes that was so heavy it took two men to carry it on a staff to bring back. They also brought back pomegranates and figs. After forty days of searching out the land the twelve men returned to the camp of Israel.

The men came before Moses and all the people of Israel and this is what they said, "We went into the land that you sent us to, and it really does flow with milk and honey (that is, it is a rich and prosperous land). But, the people are strong that live in the land, and the cities are walled, and very great, and besides that we saw the children of Anak there."

When Caleb heard his fellow spies giving this report he tried to calm the people, for they became filled with fear. He said, "Let us go in and posses this land, for we are able to conquer it." But the other ten said, "We can not go against them, for they are stronger than us."

Ten of the spies brought an evil report against the land that the Lord had promised to Israel. We seemed like grasshoppers in size compared to them."

When Moses brought the words of the Lord before the people, suddenly they realized the great wickedness that they had done.
