- 3. Though we have read it before, all these things about Abraham and Isaac were new to Rebekah. What was Abraham's servant's testimony concerning himself? v 34

Concerning Abraham's wealth and how he got it? v 35

Concerning Isaac's miraculous birth and his financial status? v 36

- 4. What was the mission of the servant that he recounted to Rebekah and her family? vv 37-41
- 5. Give a summary of the thrilling story that the servant recounted of how the LORD led him to Rebekah? vv 43-48

6. Finally the servant came to the important question. What was it? vv 48,49

7. Using verses 50, 51, 57, 58 explain whether or not Rebekah had a choice in this marriage.

What was the foundation of how the family considered whether Isaac was a suitable husband so that there were grounds for Rebekah to be given a choice?

The typological teaching here seems so clear that it should not be passed over. The servant is like the Holy Spirit, who is in the world seeking a Bride for Christ. The bride is to be made up of individuals who receive Him as Lord and Savior, and who therefore will be brought unto Him in regeneration by the Spirit. As the Holy Spirit (through human witnesses, through Scripture, through circumstances) witnesses to the hearts of individuals concerning the glories of Christ, their need of him, and the joys to be found in His presence, they are confronted with the greatest decision of their lives. They cannot ignore Him; they must say either yes or no. If they are united with Him, they must leave the things of the world behind them and submit fully to Him. Many reject the invitation and are separated forever from Him.

Another name for the Bride of Christ is the "church." The "church" is not a building, nor an organization that has been given the name church. Not every place or group that calls itself a church even has people that are the Bride of Christ in it. There are many who make the claim who are not part of Christ at all. God Himself sets the criteria for who is His Bride and His Church in His Word. The Bride and the Church are also called the Body of Christ.
