

## ISAIAH –Lesson 59

Learn: For there is no difference between the Jew and the Greek: for the same Lord over all is rich unto all that call upon him. For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved. How then shall they call upon him in whom they have not believed? and how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things! Romans 10:12-15

Read: Isaiah 52:1-15

The focus of this chapter is that God will Redeem Israel.

NOTE: “Redeemed,” “Redeem,” “Redeemer,” these words found in the Bible 136 times. Of those 127 times are in the Old Testament. 27 times are in the book of Isaiah and 25 of those times in the last 13 chapters of Isaiah.

The theme of this message is ‘THE SALVATION OF OUR GOD’- The word “salvation” of the 164 times found in the Bible, is found 21 times in the last 27 chapters of Isaiah.

The word “saved” is found 5 times in the last 27 chapters of Isaiah, and the ‘Savior’ 7 times in those same chapters.

3. What are the “beautiful garments”?

4. What reason is given that allows these beautiful garments to be put on by Zion? v 1
5. A time in Zion without any wickedness in the city has not yet occurred, when will this perfection be realized in Jerusalem? Revelation 21: 1-4, 27

6. What is the command that the LORD gives, which His people are responsible to do?  
v 2

So, His people have this responsibility, but what must we always remember?  
Psalm 113:7

Explain this seeming conflict.

7. In verse 3 we again see the concept of Israel selling herself, but getting no gain from that sale. What is the outworking of selling themselves?  
Jeremiah 15:13, 14;

Psalm 44:9-15

8 What is God's promised remedy for all who have sold themselves? v 3; I Peter 1:18, 19

9. What is the reminder to Israel from verse 4?

10. What is the sad result of God's people selling themselves into sin? v 5  
Ezekiel 36:20

11. What happens when a person who claims to know God and speaks of God's way to others, at the same time lives contrary to what they tell others?  
Romans 2:17-24

12. One day things will be different. What is the cause of that change? v 6

13. In Romans 10:13-15, the phrase "How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things" is quoted from Isaiah 52:7. In the Isaiah passage there are four things listed as the good tidings that are brought.

16. What is the “peace” that is published by the preachers? Ephesians 2:12-18

17. In spite of all that we see happening in the world, what is the good tiding that we are assured of? v 7c

Psalm 47:2; 93:1, 2

Though God is sovereign over all the earth, at this present time He has chosen not to establish His total rule of righteousness. When will this finally be implemented?

Revelation 19:11-21

18. What will the response of God’s people be to the comfort that He brings them? vv 8,9

19. How will the Lord comfort the “waste places of Jerusalem”? Isaiah 51:3

20. How will the Lord vindicate His people Israel in the sight of all the earth (which has

despised and persecuted them for so long)? v 10a

21. What else will all the nations see? v 10b Isaiah 45:22-23

What will the nations do?

22. In light of all that God tells them in the previous verses of this chapter, what does He command His people to do? v 11

23. Is the Lord's command any different for those who are in His church-for us today?  
Use II Corinthians 6:14-18 to explain your answer.

24. Since the Lord calls for this separateness from the world so often, it becomes obvious that His people have a tendency to get entangled with the world's ways and philosophies. How can this happen so easily to those who claim to love the Lord?

25. The exhortation of verse 11 is addressed specifically to those in Babylon who would have to choose between staying in the relative security there or risk the long journey back to the land of Israel. What is God's promise to those who leave as He has commanded? v 12

25. As He did to those Jews of long ago, so the Lord also makes His promise to us if we will obey His voice and separate ourselves completely from the world. What is His promise? II Corinthians 6:17, 18

26. Because we have God's promise, what should we do? II Corinthians 7:1
