

ISAIAH – Lesson 64

Learn: For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy: I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit. To revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones. Isaiah 57:15

But the wicked are like the troubled sea, when it cannot rest, whose waters cast up mire and dirt. There is no peace, saith my God, to the wicked. Isaiah 57: 20, 21

2. What kinds of different beasts that are called to devour? Ezekiel 39:17-22

How do the leaders fail according to the description given?

6. Verse 11b says that a leader is to be a shepherd. What is the duty of a shepherd?
